

May 5, 2006 QUARTERLY MEETING of- George Lake Rehabilitation District

1. CALL TO ORDER: 7pm All Board members present; 5 residents; Jeff Thornton

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. APPROVE MINUTES OF QUARTERLY MEETING Feb. 3, 2006.....

Rich Gossling/ Fred Ekornaas Minutes-- Approved

4. APPROVE TREASURERS REPORT: Jeff Coultrip stated that the General Reserve account be altered from \$15,000 minus \$215 for audit fees for 2005 which leaves General Reserve at

\$14,785. Total expenses amended to \$0. Total expenses for current month/ actual year to date \$816.18. Fred Ekornaas / Bob Chudy Treasurers Report -- Approved

5. APPROVE PAYMENT OF PENDING BILLS: Fred Ekornaas / Jeff Coultrip motioned to pay Mike Hole, Herbicides, harvester, mailing and copying for Spring Newsletter ---- Approved

6. FINAL LAKE MANAGEMENT PLAN: Jeff Thornton apologized for not completing the Management Plan. He did talk with DNR about the late final plan and the need to extend the Grant..

7. COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. Weed Control. Tentative date for herbicides when water reaches 60 degrees. Ernie Chiodo stated that the water temperature was 61 degrees, therefore, Jeff Coultrip will set up Memorial weekend as the tentative date for herbicide treatment. Harvesting will begin by the middle of May 2006.

b. Watershed. Jeff Coultrip discussed the development of property on SW side of JS which is zoned AG 1 and AG2. There are no current restrictions for livestock. The County Planning Board, DNR, and Town Planning Board are working on an agreement as there is nothing on the books regarding this provision.

c. Grants – Pearl Seavitte reported there is nothing active. Jeff Thornton stated to contact him regarding Waterways Commission grants especially now that George Lake has public lake access and parking.

d. Lake Monitoring – Ernie Chiodo gave everyone a copy of the 2005 annual report for water testing. He asked Rich Augustyn if he would consider doing the testing for 2006. Bob Chudy will do the Ecoli testing mid June 2006.

8. OLD BUSINESS: Ernie Chiodo stated the fence by North beach needs to be straightened out. Discussed asking the Harvester driver if he would do this job when he is not too busy. Rich Gossling discussed the need for opening in the fence for the truck to get in every year so that sand can be dumped on the beach.. Volunteers are needed to get markers in the water by Memorial Day.

Pearl Seavitte and Carrie Miner volunteered to get a committee for clean up at the beaches and channels. Also buy and plant flowers for the beaches. A clean-up party can be planned for all volunteers with a \$200 budget for flowers and food.

9. NEW BUSINESS: Discussion about the need for collision insurance on the truck. The Lake District needs to be considering the purchase of a new truck within the next 5 years. This will be discussed at the August meeting.

10. ANY OTHER BUSINESS ALLOWED BY LAW: Bob Chudy asked if the town of Bristol is doing anything about Fertilizers. Rich Gossling stated that the Board is working with an outlet now, however, we cannot really have a fertilizer police patrol.

Ernie Chiodo, Rich Gossling, and Jeff Coultrip recently attended the Center Lake District meeting. The guest speaker was the chairman of WAL. He discussed that larger lakes have an overcrowding of boats but this is not a problem on George Lake. Rich Gossling stated it was a very interesting meeting and would like to organize a larger Lake district with all local lakes to work together as a bigger, collective Lake District.
